

# Ernulf Academy Pupil Premium and Catch-up Provision:

## An explanation of our income and intended expenditure

### Purpose

The **Pupil Premium** is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the students who need it most. The Pupil Premium has a number of wider aims:

- To increase social mobility
- To enable more students from disadvantaged backgrounds to get to the top universities
- To reduce the attainment gap between the highest and lowest achieving pupils nationally

The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with children from Reception to Year 11 who have been eligible for free school meals at any time in the last six years (FSM6), are looked after (CLA) or have parents currently in the Armed Forces.

The **Catch-up Premium** is paid for all students who did not achieve level 4 at the end of Key Stage 2 (on leaving primary school) in reading and/or Mathematics.

For **2015-16**, Ernulf Academy's anticipated total Pupil Premium allocation was £157,847.50 and anticipated Catch-up funding was £9000. Please see **2015-16 Income Costs and Budget Planning, Expenditure Review, Action Plan and Review** and **Analysis of Intervention Impact**.

For **2016-17**, the Academy's anticipated total Pupil Premium allocation is £162,055.00 and anticipated Catch-up funding £9000. **Income Costs and Budget Planning** and **Action Plan 2016-19** documents are available.

### Our Vision

The Pupil Premium allocation for 2014-15 was used for:

- Pupil Premium/Catch-up staffing (including learning mentor)
- One-to-one tuition and small group intervention (including literacy and numeracy support)
- Breakfast Club salaries and resources
- Homework Club salaries and resources
- Curriculum support (including revision guides and classroom equipment)
- Direct financial support (including support for trips and uniform costs)
- Summer School to aid transition to the Academy

In response to the need for a new approach to improve the progress and attainment of disadvantaged students, a Senior Assistant Head teacher has taken over the lead of this area

experience of work with disadvantaged students. She confirmed that *"the distance travelled since September 2015 suggests that the school is working to be a centre of excellence for Pupil Premium and amongst the Academy leadership group there are the knowledge and skills to secure this"*.
